The WINTERHILL WAY: SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS

As we approach the end of the academic year, a reminder to all students regarding our expectations around **uniform**, **attendance and punctuality**. Students must attend school in **full school uniform**, including a suitable school bag, their learning equipment, as well as brining their full PE kit as per their timetabled lessons. Full details of our uniform expectations can be found on our website. In particular please wear correct footwear and note that **trainers** of any kind are **not permitted**.

As you would expect via our school ethos 'everyone succeeds', an attendance of 95%+, as well as arriving at school promptly at 08:45, is vital to students achieving their full potential. Each week, our tutors engage students around their attendance and punctuality with students rewarded weekly for achieving good attendance and arriving at school on time.

SCHOOL OPERATIONS in SEPTEMBER

September 2021

The start of the new term in September 2021 will see the school return to normality as the government's stage 4 plan takes effect. We now have the opportunity to fully embed the changes to the school that we had planned for September 2020.

Under the new government guidance, at Step 4 it will no longer be necessary to keep students in consistent groups ('bubbles'). This means that bubbles will not need to be used in school from the autumn term. As well as enabling flexibility in curriculum delivery, this means that assemblies can resume, and we no longer need to make alternative arrangements to avoid mixing cohorts of students at break and lunch.

Please note: Y7, Y8 and Y9 students will have their break and lunch sessions together and will have the opportunity to buy snacks and or food from 3 designated areas within the building as well a designated outside area to play and socialise. This also applies to our **Y10 and Y11 students** who will have their break and lunch sessions together.

The school day start at **8.45am** and finishes at **3.00pm**. We encourage all our students to be punctual and on time, students will be allowed into the building from **8.45am** and are expected to make their way directly to their tutor group (**Students will be given a late mark should they arrive after 8.50am**). Any students arriving after this time are required to report to the attendance office, located in student reception.

There are allocated entrance and exit points for students, to ensure a calm and orderly start to the school day and exit from the school building at 3.00pm. For our Y7, Y8 and Y9 students this will be at the main student entrance via the main school gates. Y10 and Y11 students will access and leave the school site via the school gates on Little Common Lane. The gates, entry and exit points into the school building will be supervised by members of the staff team.

On their return to school in September students will be provided with new timetables for their classes including their tutor group. Please note there are a small number of changes to tutor groups for the new academic year-students involved in these changes will be informed before the end of term to get them ready for their new classes. If there are any queries about these changes please contact the relevant Behaviour for Learning Leader.

Finally, as our students will potentially mix with lots of other people during the summer holidays, we are required to provide 2 on-site lateral flow device tests, 3 to 5 days apart, when students return to school in September and we aim to stagger the return of students to manage this (more information will be provided to parents and carers nearer the end of the summer holiday via text message, social media and the school website). Students should then continue to test twice weekly at home until the end of September, when this will be reviewed by the Government.
